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## Neuburger

### Origin:

Neuburger is a crossing of Roter Veltliner and Grüner Sylvaner. It is a native variety with an austrian origin. With a high likelihood Neuburger's origin is in the Wachau valley, from there it circulated to the other winegrowing regions of Austria.

### Character:

Neuburger has no certain claims to soil, it flourishes very well on primary rock soil in the Wachau valley as well as in the west of the city Krems. In cause of a high sensitive potential of the blossom, rot and frost it has a very unsafe harvest amount. Harvest time is from end September until early October.

### Wine:

In its youth it depends on the quality if Neuburgers taste is neutral or very fruity. Only with maturity the wine shows his often-quoted nutty almond character. He is low in acidity and is often fermented to a medium alcohol-level (until 12,5% vol).

In the vintage vinotheque at Winzer Krems you can find over decades matured late harvest wines and superior wines of Neuburger.
